National Security Language Initiative for Youth (NSLI-Y)

*NSLI-Y, FLEX Abroad, and YES Abroad are programs of the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs.*

<b>Program Description</b>	YES Abroad and FLEX Abroad provide scholarships for American high school students (ages 15-18.5) to study abroad in select countries for an academic year. <b>YES Abroad and FLEX Abroad are cultural exchange programs</b> focused on enhancing Americans' understanding of other countries and cultures through fostering lasting personal ties and engaging youth in activities that advance mutual understanding. Participants live with a host family and enroll in a local high school abroad.	NSLI-Y provides scholarships to American high school students (ages 15-18) for overseas study of critical foreign languages during a summer or an academic year. These languages are not commonly taught in U.S. high schools but are critical to America's engagement with the world. <b>NSLI-Y is a language- focused program</b> aimed at developing a cadre of young Americans who will use their language skills to advance international dialogue, compete effectively in the global economy, and promote mutual understanding.

<b>Accommodations</b>	Participants live with host families for the duration of the program	Accommodations vary by program site. Participants may reside either in a host family or combination of supervised dormitories and host family stays.
<b>Placement</b>	Participants may be placed individually or in small groups at each site. Participants are enrolled in local high schools. Placements in host families and schools vary greatly both across and within host countries.	Participants are placed in groups of approximately 5 to 30 participants per site. Groups tend to be larger for summer programs. Participants enroll in local high schools and/or language institutes.
